## Dramatic Monologue

#### Performance Parameters

This solo performance should be 90 seconds to 2 minutes in length. Timing will begin after your slate. Should you exceed 2 minutes, you will be asked to stop. There is no penalty for being stopped due to time.

The selection must be from a published play and should be dramatic in nature.

Selections from Television, Movies, Social Media, and Musicals will not be accepted.

A single chair will be available. No props or costumes may be used in the performance.

Your Slate should include your name, the title of the play from which the selection has been cut, and the author only.

"My name is Tyler Thomas. This is a selection from Arthur Miller's <u>Death</u> of a Salesman."



## Humorous Monologue

#### Performance Parameters

This solo performance should be 90 seconds to 2 minutes in length. Timing will begin after your slate. Should you exceed 2 minutes, you will be asked to stop. There is no penalty for being stopped due to time.

The selection must be from a published play and should be humorous in nature.

Selections from Television, Movies, Social Media, and Musicals will not be accepted.

A single chair will be available. No props or costumes may be used in the performance.

Your Slate should include your name, the title of the play from which the selection has been cut, and the author only.

"My name is Tyler Thomas. This is a selection from Arthur Miller's <u>Death</u> of a Salesman."



## Duo Performance

#### Performance Parameters

This Duo performance should be 2 to 3 minutes in length. Timing will begin after your slate. Should you exceed 3 minutes, you will be asked to stop. There is no penalty for being stopped due to time.

The selection must be from a published play and may be humorous or dramatic in nature.

Selections from Television, Movies, Social Media, and Musicals will not be accepted.

Two chairs will be available. No props or costumes may be used in the performance. You should strive for a balance between characters within the scene.

Your Slate should include your names, the title of the play from which the selection has been cut, and the author only.

Renderings A rendering is a finished design that is approved by the creative team. This is the design that would be sent to the shop manager as the main guide for construction.



## Elements

**Design Statement** Five to eight sentences in length.

**Thumbnails** Four Thumbnails for a NEW production of ALICE IN WONDERLAND.

Include the following characters:
ALICE, CHESHIRE CAT, MAD HATTER, QUEEN OF HEARTS.

**Renderings** Two Renderings based on your Thumbnails.





Your thumbnail *may* include secondary point of views of the costume and/or different perspectives (i.e. a profile or the costume under a cloak).

Be certain to label each of your Thumbnail designs.





#### Renderings

A rendering is a finished design that is approved by the creative team. A rendering should be a clean design on lineless paper. The design may include shading and should be in color. This is the design that would be sent to the shop manager as the main guide for construction.

Your rendering *may* include secondary point of views of the costume and/or different perspectives if they were included in the Thumbnail (i.e. a profile or the costume under a cloak). Your rendering *may* also include fabric swatches.

Be certain to label each of your renderings.



## Renderings

A rendering is a finished design that is approved by the creative team. A rendering should be a clean design on lineless paper. The design may include shading and should be in color. This is the design that would be sent to the shop manager as the main guide for construction.

Your rendering *may* include a silhouette of a performer to further express set dimensions. Your rendering *may* also include paint swatches like those found in most hardware stores.

Be certain to label each of your renderings.
